Contact: Linda Fitzpatrick

- Volunteers are needed to water the live plants in the church on a rotating schedule. Training is provided, rotating schedule. (1 hour per week)
- Volunteers are needed to decorate for Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, and Easter as well as liturgical celebrations such as First Communion, First Mass & Confirmation. No experience is necessary. (2 hrs per occasion)

- **Funeral Luncheon Crew Leader** Volunteers help set up the church basement and serve the meal and clean as needed. Training will be provided. If interested, please call the parish office. *Time and commitment determined by the number of funerals.*
- **Funeral Luncheon Food Provider** Parishioners prepare salads and desserts for the luncheon. You will receive a phone call from a volunteer on a rotating schedule. *Time and commitment determined by the number of funerals.*
- **Funeral Luncheon Callers** Volunteers call parishioners to get food donations. *Time and commitment determined by the number of funerals.*

Christian Action Commission – Contact: Fr. Geoff

- **Backpack and Beyond Program** – Contact: Fr. Geoff. Volunteer works with a Pastoral Team member and Clay Church during the Backpack and Beyond Program the month of July. Responsibilities would include writing bulletin announcements, collecting donations and delivering them to Clay Church on the appointed day. (Seasonal, 4 hrs)
- **Casserole Program** – Contact: Dee Rogers. Weekly service for the Center for the Homeless and the YWCA. Families or individuals are provided with a pan and recipe and supply their own ingredients to make a large casserole and deliver it to church. (3 hrs, 2-4 times/year)
- **Commission Member** – Contact: Fr. Geoff. Members meet once a month to initiate and coordinate community outreach and justice ministries. Activities include community involvement and social justice education. (10-15 hrs per year.)
- **Food Deliverer for Center for the Homeless** – Contact: Dee Rogers. Drivers are needed once a month to deliver the Casseroles and Pack-a-Lunches to the Center for the Homeless. (1 hr once a month - 12 times a year)

- **Food Pantry Food Deliverers** – Contact: Dee Rogers. Parishioners are needed to pack perishable and non-perishable food items from the food pantry and deliver to area families during the day. **Must be available during the hours of 8 am – 4 pm Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday.** A delivery usually takes 1 hour. *Time frame depends on the number of volunteers and deliveries.*
- **Giving Tree** – Contact: Linda Hatfield. Parishioners deliver Christmas gifts to families and nursing home residents in Clay Township. Parishioners are needed to sort and deliver gifts. Sign-up sheets will be posted in the church vestibule in November. (Seasonal)
- **Holiday Food Basket Delivery** – Contact: Tim Noble. Parishioners are needed to pack and deliver food baskets to needy families at Thanksgiving and Christmas. Sign-up sheets will be posted in the church vestibule a few weeks prior to each holiday. (Seasonal, 1 hr)
- **Pack-a-Lunch Program** – Contact: Dee Rogers. Parishioners make sandwiches and assemble sack lunches for the Center for the Homeless. (1 hr, 2-4 times year.)
- **Women's Care Center Crib Club** – Contact: Elizabeth Sain. A volunteer is needed to write bulletin announcements about the Crib Club Drive which takes place the last weekend of April and the first weekend in May. The volunteer would recruit volunteers and schedule them to sit at a table to collect money on these weekends. (3 hrs, once per year)
- **Women's Care Center Diaper Drive** – Contact: Elizabeth Sain. Volunteers are responsible for taking the diapers to the center each week of the diaper drive and keep count of everything that is collected. The volunteer is also responsible to write bulletin announcements about the Diaper Drive. (6 hrs, once per year)

Church Fellowship – Contact: Fr. Geoff

- **Marriage in Christ** – Contact: Deacon Joe Dietz. Program for married couples. Next class begin in September, please see the bulletin for more details and to register.
- **Men of Faith** – Contact: Fr. Geoff. Men of Faith meet for breakfast twice a month. Each meeting will comprise a group discussion on theological and spiritual topics. (Twice a month for an hour)
- **St. Gianna Moms Group** – Contact: Abigail Ulbrich. Moms gather for monthly meetings to share community, grow in faith, and discuss various topics. **Childcare volunteers (Safe Environment Training is required)** are needed the second Thursday of each month. (1 ½ hrs monthly, Sept-May.)

- **St. Helen Divorce Ministry – Contact: Fr. Steve.**

Surviving Divorce was created to bring hope and healing to those who have experienced the pain and loneliness of a broken marriage. It is for the newly separated and divorced and those still struggling with issues many years later. It helps them find answers to their questions, restore hope, and begin authentic healing.

- **“That Man Is You!” – Contact: Kevin Kaufhold.** That Man is You! (TMIY) is an interactive men’s program combining the best research from science with the teachings of the Catholic faith and the wisdom of the saints to develop the vision of a man fully alive. By honestly addressing the pressures and temptations that men face in our modern culture, *That Man is You* seeks to form men who will be capable of transforming homes and society. The program for the year is divided into two 13-week semesters. All men are welcome!

Faith Formation – Contact: Teresa Oross

- **Bible Study/Small Group Leader – Contact: Teresa Oross.** Small faith sharing groups gather to deepen their faith throughout the Lenten Season. **Group leaders** are responsible for using the provided materials to facilitate small group discussion. **Hosts** provide a welcoming environment for small group meetings. *(3 hours/week for 12 weeks per year)*
- **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd – Contact: Joanie Rymsza.** Parishioners are needed in a variety of roles; as catechists, catechist assistants, and to make various catechetical materials. Needed talents include making paper cut-outs, sewing, artistic drawing, painting, calligraphy and woodworking. Catechists are required to attend training. **Safe Environment Training is required.** *Time commitment varies.*
- **Children’s Liturgy of the Word – Contact: Teresa Oross.** Ministers escort children from the 8:45am Mass prior to the readings and homily. Leaders proclaim the readings and gospel to the children and lead them in a short reflection on the readings. Reflections and training provided. **Safe Environment Training is required.** *(Scheduled about once per month)*
- **RCIA Team Member – Contact: Teresa Oross.** Spiritual formation for non-Catholics seeking Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism-Confirmation-Eucharist) or full initiation into the Catholic Church. **Sponsors and Team Members** are needed. **Sponsor** Commitment varies with candidate needs. **Team Members** assist at Sunday dismissals and weekly meetings. *Time frame: varies.*
- **Religious Education Catechist** - The program is designed for students not attending a Catholic school who desire to deepen the understanding in the Catholic Faith. Classes begin in September and run the second week in May. **Safe Environment Training is required.**
- **Vacation Bible School – Contact person: Parish office.** One-week summer program for children ages 4 to 9 (entering 4th grade). **Coordinator** and many parishioners are needed to serve as **group and activity leaders** as the children engage in songs, stories, crafts, skits, and snacks. Volunteers must at least be in the 5th grade. **Safe Environment Training is required.**

Hospitality Ministry – Contact: Teresa Oross

- **Belonging** – Ministry to those with disabilities. Those serving in this committee will discuss and implement ways that can make those with disabilities feel more included. *(Quarterly meetings, 1 ½ hrs)*
- **Newcomer Brunch** – Volunteers make breakfast casseroles and serve at the Newcomer Brunch scheduled three times a year.
- **Welcome Desk & Greeter Volunteer** – Volunteers stand at the Welcome Desk before and after weekend Masses to greet and answer any questions that guests may have about the parish. Training provided. *(15-25 minutes each assigned weekend).*

Leadership Ministry – Contact: Fr. Steve

- **Finance Council** - The Finance Council is comprised of parishioners with expertise in a variety of finance-related fields. They meet monthly to advise the Pastor and Business Manager on a variety of financial issues. They also review parish financial statements and approve the parish and school budgets. Parishioners with professional experience and training are encouraged to ask Fr. Steve about membership on the Finance Council.
- **Pastoral Council** -The Pastoral Council is a group of parishioners who advise the Pastor on many different aspects of parish life. This group is instrumental in creating our Parish Strategic Plan and making sure we stay on track with the goals of this plan. Members are invited from among parishioners who are already active in parish ministry to serve a maximum of two three-year terms.
- **School Board** -The School Board is comprised of school parents who advise the Pastor and school administration on many different aspects of our educational ministry, including the areas covered by our School Strategic Plan (Catholic Identity, Finance & Development, Curriculum & Instruction, Marketing & Enrollment, Facilities). Members are invited to serve a maximum of two three-year terms.

Liturgical Ministry – Contact: Teresa Oross

Frequency varies per schedule/volunteers.

Training provided.

- **Altar Server – Contact: Fr. Steve.** Children (5th grade and older) and adults assist at the altar during Sunday and weekday liturgies.
- **Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion** – Assist at Mass by distributing the Body and Blood of the Lord.
- **Eucharistic Minister to the Homebound** – Parishioners visit those who are homebound or in a nursing home due to illness or age, bringing them Holy Communion and fellowship.
- **Lector** – Proclaim the Word of God at Mass.

- **Master of Ceremony – Contact: Fr. Steve.** (9-12 grade) MC's are experienced altar servers who perform special tasks at Sunday Mass, assist at major liturgies (Triduum, Confirmation, etc.), and serve as leaders and mentors for younger servers.
- **Sacristan (Daily or Weekend) – Contact: Fr. Steve.** Arrives early to set up everything needed for (Sunday) Mass. Training provided.
- **Usher** – Welcome and assist all parishioners and visitors joining us for Sunday Mass. This ministry is open to all ages and families are welcome to serve together. Training provided.

Music Ministry – Contact: Jessica Roberts

- **Cantor** – The cantors of Christ the King are strong leaders and exceptional musicians. They must be able to lead the congregation in song as well as practice and live their faith. They fulfill an important role during the summer, as well as throughout the year.
- **Contemporary Worship Ensemble** – A new group in the formation process, the Contemporary Worship Ensemble meets to worship the Lord and serves at Adoration & Worship nights, as well as other devotional and community events. All ages are welcome to inquire to help get this group up and running.
- **Handbell Choir** – Rehearses Wednesday 6-7 pm and rings at the Sunday 8:45 am Mass during Advent, Lent, Easter, and a few additional times. Ringing bells is fun and easy to learn!
- **Instrumentalist** – We welcome instrumentalists for special liturgies, prayer evenings, retreats, feasts and solemnities, and some Sunday Masses.
- **Saint Hildegard Schola** – A new, auditioned group that will rehearse on Sundays at 9:45 before singing at the 10:30 Mass. Members must sight-read music with ease and sing confidently 1-on-a-part.
- **Seasonal Singers** – Those with limited availability may join our choirs for a smaller commitment of time. There is a seat waiting for you!
- **School Choirs** – The school's liturgical choirs (St. Cecilia Choir, grades 4-5, and St. Gregory Choir, grades 6-8), grow in musical skill and faith as they provide music for school Masses and other special liturgies for the school and parish. They meet Tuesday/Wednesday respectively from 3-4:15 PM. **Parent or teacher helpers are needed for each rehearsal. Safe Environment Training is needed.**
- **Voces Ecclesiae "Voices of the Church"** – A choir of volunteer parishioners with a love of singing. Rehearsals are Wednesdays 7-8:30 pm, and sings every Sunday at 8:45 am, with breaks in winter and summer. Sings for all our parish's important solemnities and feasts such as the Solemnity of Christ the King, Christmas, and Holy Week/Easter. Ability to read music is helpful but not required - you will learn!

Parish Service Ministries – Contact: Parish Office

- **Childcare for Parish Events** – Childcare volunteers are needed various parish functions. ***Safe Environment Training is required.***
- **Collection Counter – Contact: Jeanne Flanagan.** Count the weekly Mass tithe collections on Sunday and Monday morning. Parishioners work as teams on a rotating schedule. (3 hrs/month)
- **Marriage Preparation Couples – Contact: Fr. Steve.** Married couples meet with engaged couples in preparation for their wedding.
- **Nursing Home Volunteer** – Healthwin is a nearby nursing facility. Parishioners are needed to push patients in wheelchairs from their rooms to Sunday Mass in the Healthwin chapel. (*appx. 1 Sunday per month*) Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are also needed and may be scheduled more frequently.
- **St. Simeon's Candle Ministry – Contact: Linda Fitzpatrick.** Teams of volunteers clean and maintain the votives and replace the candles for this prayerful devotion. *Rotating schedule and training provided.*
- **Sacristy Cleaning – Contact: Linda Fitzpatrick.** Weekly light cleaning (vacuuming, dusting, etc.) of the sacristy and sanctuary areas. This is a great ministry for families! (*2 hours 3 times/year*)
- **Sacristy Laundry – Contact: Linda Fitzpatrick.** Volunteers wash and iron sacristy laundry on a rotating schedule. (*4-6 times/year*)

Prayer Ministry – Contact: Parish Office

- **Eucharistic Adoration** – Parishioners commit to spend one hour in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament on designated Fridays.
- **Prayer Line – Contact: Martha Suter.** Prayer warriors join a long-standing, extensive prayer chain network within our parish through phone calls or email.
- **Prayer Planning Committee – Contact: Corinne Gries.** This committee plans and coordinates three prayer services that take place on the church grounds throughout the year: Living Rosary (October), Stations of the Cross (Lent), and May Crowning (May). Participating in this ministry involves: working with fellow committee members through planning meetings in the weeks leading up to the prayer service and assisting with the logistics on the day of each prayer service.
- **Respect Life Rosary – Contact: Elizabeth Sain** Parishioners gather on Monday evenings at 6:30pm in the Holy Cross Chapel to pray the rosary. Check with Contact person to make sure COVID precautions have been lifted for in person prayer.
- **Sister Parish** – Corpus Christi in Jalchatra, Bangladesh **Contact: Fr. Geoff.** Families are matched with members of Corpus Christi and they pray for each other.
- **Vocation Chalice – Contact: Linda Fitzpatrick.** Families agree to take the Vocation Chalice home from Mass and pray for vocations during that week. (*3-5 times/year*)

Social Life Ministry – Contact: Fr. Geoff

- **Brewfest** – Volunteers are needed to help plan and organize our annual parish celebration.
- **Doughnut Sunday – Contact: Melissa Nebus.** Parishioners coordinate and serve doughnuts the first Sunday of each month after 7:00, 8:45 and 10:30 AM (Sept., Oct., Nov., Feb., April). We are looking for adult and teen volunteers. *Time frame: 1-2 hrs*
- **Fish Fry – Contact: Abigail Ulbrich.** Parishioners are needed to help plan, set up, serve, and clean up. *(Seasonal Ministry in March, 2-4 hrs)*
- **Parish Receptions** – Volunteers are needed to help plan and organize Receptions after the Mass of Remembrance, Presbyterial Ordinations and other parish special receptions held throughout the year.
- **Parish Picnic** – Parishioners are needed to help cook, set-up and tear down, lead games, and assist with other picnic duties.
- **Social Life Committee** – Committee members meet monthly to help plan social events for our parish community.
- **Trivia Night** – Parishioners are needed to help organize, set up and tear down, lead games and assist with other duties for Trivia Night.

Youth Ministry – Contact: Abigail Ulbrich

- **Chaperones and meeting volunteers are needed.** Chaperones are needed for our larger/off site/overnight events. Meeting volunteers are adults who are witnesses of Christian discipleship and would attend/assist at weekly Sunday night meetings. Adult time commitment can be limited to individual events or weekly participation. *Safe Environment Training is required.*
